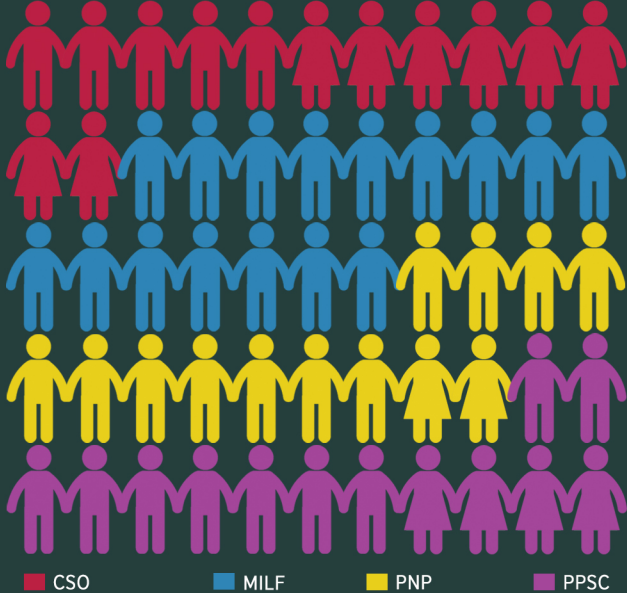


OUR MILESTONES

110 Facilitators Trained on Community Consultations

TRAINING OF TRAINERS

During the review period, the project has trained **110** facilitators on methods for effective consultation. As of 30 November, about **2,406** individuals have been consulted. The facilitators are in the final stage of the community consultations. Preliminary analysis has been done.

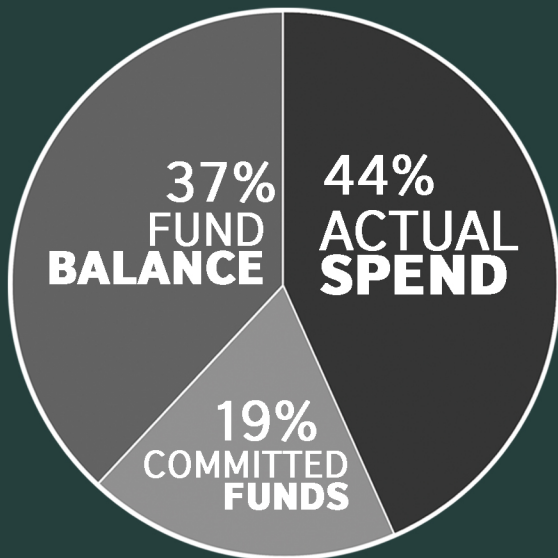
AWARENESS RAISING ACTIVITIES

Continuous awareness raising is being implemented to ensure that messages are consistent. A poster has been designed on the basic community policing elements. A brochure and multimedia material for digital channels have been completed. Through our efforts, more than **23,000** people have been engaged.

STAKEHOLDER NETWORKING

The project has achieved significant progress in terms of stakeholder networking. From September, the team has attended various forums to showcase the project: a **security summit** in Mindanao, a **legislative roundtable** on the modernisation bill for the Philippine National Police, **catch-up meetings** with the Philippines EU delegation, local FCO and the members of the Joint Normalisation Committee of the Peace Process. Phillip Thomson, team leader of the project, received an award from the Philippine Public Safety College for the project's contribution to community policing.

UK-PHILIPPINES KNOWLEDGE EXCHANGE

The technical working group had a **study visit** on 8-13 November 2015 in North Wales. In the latest annual results for the Crime Survey for England and Wales (formerly called British Crime Survey) published in January 2015, the North Wales police topped in community policing in Wales and is second out of the 43 forces in England and Wales. The TWG was received by leaders and influencers as well as the operational team on the ground. Together with regional contracts colleagues, British Council's Global Head of Justice (Christopher Marshall) and Civil Society and Governance (Amisha Patel) had a **community visit** in the Bangsamoro to interact with the project stakeholders including community members the PNP, PPSC and MILF.
